Re 5. Follow-up on corona-related issues

In terms of extensions, the most urgent cases, meaning PhD students who have their thesis submission deadline now, have been processed. In late October/early November, the secretariat will follow up and notify PhD students and supervisors if further action needs to be taken.

With regard to Research environment change: It was agreed to be very flexible as it may not be possible to go abroad.

With regard to teaching load in relation to Research environment change: If there are any matters pertaining to this, the PhD student should discuss it with his or her department.

Re 6. Transferable skills courses

The proposal for the GSNS and GSTS transferable skills course portfolio for 2021 was approved.

It was debated whether some of the courses could possibly be converted to online courses.

Action: The secretariat will discuss this with the course lecturers.

A new course for the course portfolio was suggested, namely data-analysis with Python, as alternative to the existing course using R.

Action: Anders Møller will talk to course lecturer at CS about the possibility of teaching a Python course at PhD level.

- Department of Agroecology, Center for Quantitative Genetics and Genomics
- Department of Food Science, Department of Animal Science
